Announcing summer studios for recent VCUarts alumni

VCUarts is pleased to announce an opportunity for six recently graduated alumni to receive free summer studios and exhibit their work in the Anderson building.

Three rooms on the third floor of the Anderson will be made available for use as studios. Each room ranges in size from approximately 500 – 700 square feet and will be shared by two artists. All six artists will exhibit their work in the galleries of the Anderson in a group exhibition that will go on view in August.

Who is eligible:

Alumni who received their BFA or MFA degrees between May 2011 and May 2016. Currently enrolled students are not eligible.

How to apply:

Submit the following:

- Your name, contact information, degree and date of graduation
- A short statement on your current work, including some details on what you might like to accomplish in your summer studio, as well as what you might exhibit (400 words max)
- Up to 5 jpgs of recent work, and/or links to digital/audio work online. Please keep attached file sizes below 5 MB each.

Compile these materials into a single email and send with the subject line “Application for summer studio” to ljross@vcu.edu

Timeline:

Application deadline – May 10

Notification of acceptance – May 15

Studios available for use – June 1 through August 31

Exhibition of work in gallery – opens August 4 (closing date to be determined)

The fine print:

Studio spaces are being offered unfurnished and “as is.” Selected artists must be self-sufficient, as there is no staff or faculty support available. Selected artists must return the spaces they are assigned to the same condition they were in at the beginning of the residency period. Access to art-making facilities in other buildings on campus may be possible, but are not guaranteed; please indicate if access to particular facilities is desired. Please also indicate if applicant has any special needs. No housing or stipends are being offered to participants. A modest administrative fee may be required in order to have a university identification card issued to selected artists.
